THE BANDS OF DEATH could not hold Him, and the victorious Son of God came forth from the grave early on that first day of the week. His enemies must now come up with an explanation for why the tomb was empty. Previously the Jewish religious leaders had met with Pilate to communicate with him their concern that Jesus' disciples might steal the body, and they suggested a plan to prevent this. Pilate agreed to post Roman guards to protect the tomb so that the body would not be removed (Matt. 27:62-66). Anyone trying to do this would face two major obstacles—the massive stone blocking the entrance way and Roman guards keeping careful watch. Neither obstacle was too great for the Lord of Life, and the world's greatest miracle took place with ease.

When guards failed to do their job, it was a serious matter, often resulting in the death penalty. In this case the guards were not punished at all but paid a large sum of money to tell a phony story (Matt. 28:11-15). Here's the fake news they were to relate: "His disciples came by night, and stole Him away while we slept" (v.13). This is one of the most absurd statements found in the Word of God. It would be almost funny if it were not so pitiful. The obvious question for the guards would be, "If you were sound asleep, then how do you know what happened?" People who are sleeping are not the best eyewitnesses!

Fake news can never nullify the stupendous event that happened on that day. To this day atheists and agnostics have utterly failed to explain the empty tomb. Instead of fake news, we have the good news of the Gospel: "I am He that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore!" (Rev. 1:18). ~George Zeller:

Life On The Other Side

There is a phrase being overused that I'd rather not write. I will reference it by saying it is the opposite of the old normal. They mention things like the need for drastic changes in the healthcare system, lack of trust in the globalized world, possible changes in passports/immunizations, greater government surveillance and overreach, effects of prolonged isolation and social distancing. All these changes create a landscape that, for some, might be intimidating. What will life be like on the other side of this virus?

We are not the first to wonder what it will be like on the other side. After the days of mourning for Moses, the people of God prepared to cross over the River Jordan. They were told to keep the ark in view, "that you may know the way by which you shall go, for you have not passed this way before" (Josh. 3:1-4). Aaron's rod that budded represented God's miraculous power. The tables of stone represented God's word. The pot of manna represented God's providence. All of these showed God's presence with the people. Imagine that you are finally crossing into the promised land that your parents had been talking about yet were not able to see; they died in the wilderness. Moses also was gone, the leader that had done so many wondrous signs. You are now led by Joshua. For some, being under new management, in a new land, with a new task creates uncertainty. However, with God a constant, they were able to see the task through.

There have been others that traveled uncertain roads in the past. "Noah, being warned by God about things not yet seen, in reverence prepared an ark for the salvation of his household" (Heb. 11:7). "Abraham, when he was called, obeyed by going out to a place which he was to receive for an inheritance; and he went out, not knowing where he was going" (Gen. 12:1; Heb. 11:8-10). "By faith [Moses] left Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king; for he endured, as seeing Him who is unseen" (Heb. 11:24-27). These all had faith in God, a directive to complete, and the courage to go.

We stand today on the cusp of a shift in our culture. As more and more restrictions are lifted and people emerge from isolation, it is probable that life will not ever be the same as it ever was. There is some uncertainty ahead. There are new habits and changes to what was once normal. We will adapt and forget what it was like before, much like we did with TSA after 9/11. With all the change, some things are the same. We are under the same management of the Creator. We are in the same land looking forward to the new heavens and earth. We have the same task at hand.
