Henry Ward Beecher, the famous pulpit orator, had to be absent one time. His brother was invited to speak for him. The church was crowded, but when it became evident the eloquent Henry Beecher was not going to appear, many started to leave. Beecher's brother was not disturbed. He stood up before the murmuring crowd, call for silence and said, "All who came this morning to worship Henry W. Beecher may now leave. The rest will remain and worship God."

Worship has nothing to do with the song leader or the talent of the preacher. It has to do with you and your God. Let people do what they will to please themselves. "The rest will remain and worship God.

The Victory that is Mine in Christ

When we live in sin, we are "bondservants of sin" (John 8:34, Rom. 6:17). Only Christ can break the shackles. "Since then the children are sharers in flesh and blood, he also himself in like manner partook of the same; that through death he might bring to nought him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; and might deliver all them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage (Heb. 2:14-15). Only Jesus Christ can set me free. No one else can overcome Satan, but Jesus has!

We live, we sin, we die, then what? Christ is the answer. We live for Him. "This is the end of the matter; all hath been heard: fear God, and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man" (Eccl. 12:13). Even though we sin, "Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8). The fear of death is destroyed by His resurrection from the dead. "Since then the children are sharers in flesh and blood, he also himself in like manner partook of the same; that through death he might bring to nought him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; and might deliver all them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage (Heb. 2:14-15).

The apostle Paul writes of that resurrection. "If we have hoped in Christ in this life, we are of all men most pitiable. But now hath Christ been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of them that are asleep...If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body...as we have borne the image of the earthly; we shall also bear the image of the heavenly...For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality...The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law; but thanks be to God, who giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15:19-20, 44, 49, 53, 56-57). Jesus says, "Be of good cheer; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). If I live for Him, walk with Him, then His victory is mine! That is why I am a Christian.

Why aren't you a Christian? Jesus wants you to be. He promises to save you from sin, to help you through this life and take you home with him to live forever. If there is a God, and the Bible is His word, then Jesus is the Christ. Christ is the only means of coming to God. Think on these things

Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things (Phil. 4:8).

Things that are true – Let our thoughts be upon things that are superior, things of worth, things of excellence and value.

Things that are Just – Let us think about things that are upright, honest, and free of bias, things that are right and moral, fair, and right conduct. In all our thinking let us be guided by the Bible while making inquiry to God in prayer.

Things that Are Pure – Let our thoughts be on heaven and heavenly things and let our minds be set on things that are superior, things free from moral corruption and evil intent. May our hearts be pure, and may we recall the words we sing in Mrs. A. L. Davidson's song: "Purer in heart, O God, Help me to be." We need to always recall and live according to the words of Jesus when He said, "Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God" (Matt. 5:8).

Things that are Lovely – Think on things that are lovely and beautiful. Let us think on the beautiful qualities

And pleasing things that are seen in the lives of men women, and children. Think on the beauty of God's plan for us and the handiwork of His vast creation. From a song, we have the warm admonition and encouragement to sing, "Let the Beauty of Jesus Be Seen." Yes, let the beauty of Christ be seen in you and me.

Things of Good Report – Consider and think about things that are favorable, right, and proper, things that will endure, things that are correct and honorable, and things that have approval. Things having approval would include the good works of Christians. The Bible reveals many things that are of good report. In writing to the Colossians, Paul mentioned hearing of their faith in Christ and love for all the saints (1:4). Another example is in his epistle to the Romans, in which he wrote that their faith was spoken of throughout the world (1:8)

Virtue and Praise – In considering virtue, our thoughts most likely include things of moral excellence, right decisions and actions. Also, we would undoubtedly think about such things as justice, prudence, fortitude, temperance, and certainly faith, hope, and charity. Also, let us have good vision and see the commendable deeds of our fellow saints.

In conclusion, let us meditate (think deeply and continuously) on things that are noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report, virtuous, and commendable. Moreover, we know that the peace of God surpasses all understanding and will guard out hearts and minds through Jesus Christ: "For our citizenship is in heaven; whence also we wait for a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Phil. 4:7). Accordingly, let us set our minds on Christ and rejoice in knowing that our citizenship is in heaven: "For our citizenship is in heaven; whence also we wait for a Saviour the Lord Jesus Christ" (3:20). ~Orville Worley
