Complete in Christ

Anyone who has ever worked a jigsaw puzzle only to find one piece is missing knows how much we care about completeness. It doesn't matter if 499 pieces of a 500-piece puzzle are there and in place. It doesn't matter that one can tell exactly the picture the puzzle makes and can admire its beauty. If one piece is missing, its incompleteness is what matters most.

People need completing too. Although our physical bodies are an incredible collection of various systems and processes, proclaimed by the Psalmist to be wonderful (Ps 139:14). There is more to us than just our physical being. Man has always searched outside of himself for something bigger and more important than himself. His search is for completeness. Even in philosophical and educated Athens, Paul witnessed this desire as it manifested itself in the misguided attempt to worship unknown gods (Ac 17). Man's completion, though, can only be found in Jesus Christ. "For in Him all the fullness of Deity dwells in bodily form, and in Him you have been made complete, and He is the head over all rule and authority" (Cl 2:9-10).

Only Jesus can makes us complete, because only in Jesus is all the fullness of Deity found. Reach the beautiful and incredible description of just who and what Jesus is that is found in Colossians 1:15-19, There simply is no one who can compare. Certainly, many of man's feeble efforts cannot provide for man the completeness only found in Christ – not philosophies, traditions, worship of angels, visions or self-made religion (Cl 2:8, 18, 23). Instead, completeness is found in the salvation provided in Christ. Descriptions of that salvation serve as bookends to the glorious picture of Christ in Colossians 1:15-19 (see 1:13-14; 1:20-23). It is also found in one's continued spiritual development.

Paul's prayer for Christians is for them to be "filled" with knowledge of God's will so they may "walk in a manner worthy of the Lord to please Him in all respects" (Cl 1:9). He continued to explain how this can happen by bearing fruit, increasing in the knowledge of God, being strengthened with power and giving thanks to the Father (Cl 1:10-12).

Completeness is unquestionably important and only genuinely available in Christ.
