## The Elephant Foot Effect (Con't)

Standing in the room with it for five minutes would lead to a relatively quick death. Thirty seconds near it would cause dizziness and fatigue. Two minutes of exposure and your cells would begin to hemorrhage. Four minutes would cause vomiting, diarrhea, and fever. Five minutes and you would have just days to live. How close can we get to sin?

In any form, sin is deadly. It doesn't matter the size or shape of it. Eve just ate some fruit. She was hungry. She deserved to eat (Gen. 3:6). The problem was she had been commanded not to eat of that fruit. All Lot's wife did was look at something the wrong way. She just looked back (Gen. 19:26). Her home was being destroyed, people she knew were dying. Who would blame her? She had been commanded not to look back. All Uzzah did was touch the ark of the covenant (1 Chr. 13:9-10). It looked like it was going to tip, so he steadied the ark. It makes sense. Anybody would do the same thing, right? God had commanded him not to touch it. Sin is deadly. Sin is a breaking of the law in any form (1 John 3:4).

We need to be careful. The psalmist wrote about the dangers of walking, standing, and sitting with those that would lead us down the path of sin (Psa. 1:1). Paul, after completing the list of the works of the flesh wrote, "I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God" (Gal. 5:21). People are always looking for way to get close to the edge, wondering how far is too far. We must draw a line where the Bible does. We can look to no other source as a guide to keep us on the right path. That's why the psalmist wrote, "How blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, Nor stand in the path of sinners, Nor sit in the seat of scoffers! But his delight is in the law of the LORD, And in His law he meditates day and night... For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, But the way of the wicked will perish" (Psa. 1:1-2). 

### Are We Keeping the World Out of the Church?

South Florida has a ground water issue that not many other places in the U.S. deal with—the salinization of fresh water aquifers. Since 1985, there has been an increase in the salinity of the Biscayne Aquifer. In that time, there has been a 12-17% decrease in available freshwater. There are many factors, one of those is the amount of fresh water pumped out. If it is not replaced, it leaves room for salt water to seep in if the aquifer is inside the saltwater intrusion line. It is a threat to the purity of our water. There is a similar threat to the church.

We are here in this world and we are charged to keep the church "without spot or wrinkle" (Eph. 5:27). What are we allowing to seep into the church? The world around us is far from holy. The United States is seemingly more and more polarized on issues. Many are getting a steady diet of half-truths and politicized information, all of which drives a larger wedge between neighbors. While in the recent past we may have been able to talk about these differences and still be civil, even friendly, it seems like that ability is also slipping away. Is that also seeping into the church?

To keep the influences of the world around us out we must stand on the truth of God's word. There is a lot of information out there that is being spun in every direction. The church should not be a place where that happens. "I write so that you will know how one ought to conduct himself in the household of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and support of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:15). Filling our hearts up with His truth should leave little room for the deception that is in the world. "Your word I have treasured in my heart, that I may not sin against You" (Psa. 119:11).

To keep the influences of the world around us out of the church we must strive for unity. It is what Christ prayed for (John 17:21-22). It was what Paul prescribed for the churches (1 Cor. 1:10; Eph. 4:3). "Make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose. Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others" (Phil. 2:2-4). Do your part to maintain unity in the church (Rom. 12:18).

Lastly, to keep the influences out we must labor in love. "Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity" (Col. 3:14). Love looks for the best in others and keeps no record of wrongs (1 Cor. 13:4-7). We will need all of these and more for the church to keep the world out. ~Josh Blackmer

# The Elephant Foot Effect

In April 1986, the explosion of rector four at the Chernobyl powerplant sent a four-million-pound lid from the reactor core through the roof of the plant and belched out 400 times more radiation than the nuclear blast at Hiroshima. Over 350,000 pounds of uranium melted down and ate through the containment shield. It ate through 6 feet of reinforced concrete. The radioactive lava flowed through basement pipes and pooled in steam corridors until it cooled enough to be stopped in the basement of reactor four. This material, called corium, is some of the most dangerous on the planet, but also very rare. It is only formed in a nuclear meltdown. In December 1986, workers found what has now been dubbed the elephant's foot. It is a two-ton wrinkled mass of corium in the basement of the reactor. It is extremely dangerous. (Continued on back)
