Temptations and Trials

Temptation comes to all of us, none of us are immune to temptation. Even the Son of God, as He walked on this earth as a man experienced temptation (Heb 4:15). Even Jesus was tempted, just as we are, yet He was able to resist temptation and did not sin.

Scripture says, "Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God; for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempteth no man: but each man is tempted, when he is drawn away by his own lust, and enticed" (James 1:13-14). As long as we are in this life, Satan is going to place temptations in front of us. And, we need to be prepared for such obstacles as He puts in our way (1 Peter 5:8). Satan is constantly on the prowl, seeking ways to draw us away from the Lord and leading us into sin.

Our real problem with temptation is rooted in the pleasures which sin gives. It is written of Moses, "Choosing rather to share ill treatment with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season" (Heb. 11:25). If there was no pleasure in sin, few of us would be tempted. If we could only see how brief the pleasure is and how long the remorse for our misdeeds will endure, the temptation would not be as strong.

The word of God helps us do that. "With my heart have I sought thee: Oh let me not wander from thy commandments. Thy word have I laid up in my heart, that I might not sin against thee" (Psalm 119:10-11). But even temptation can help us – if we let it. "Count it all joy, my brethren, when ye fall into manifold temptation; Knowing that the proving of your faith worketh patience. And let patience have its perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, lacking in nothing" (James 1:2-4). When we succumb to temptation, it becomes a curse to us. But when we resist temptation, it can bring us closer to God. (James 4:7-8). Even temptation becomes a means of pushing us closer to God and His blessings.

The Lord Jesus told the apostles, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to the whole creation. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:15-16). The apostle Paul later wrote, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also the Greek. For therein is revealed a righteousness of God from faith unto faith: as it is written, But the righteous shall live by faith" (Rom 1:16-17). Surely, then, the gospel is a blessing to mankind.

The gospel points the way to God through faith in Jesus Christ as His Son. "No man can come to me, except the Father that sent me draw him and I will raise him up in the last day. It is written in the prophets, And they shall all be taught of God. Everyone that hath heard from the Father, and hath learned, cometh unto me" (John 6:44-45). And it offers eternal salvation to all people (2 Tim. 2:10). That word is able to save your souls (James 1:21), and "is able to build you up, and to give you the inheritance among all them that are sanctified" (Acts 20:32). It is by that revealed word that God "hath granted unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that called us by his own glory and virtue" (2 Peter 1:3). And that gospel equips us to become mature (2 Tim. 3:16-17). The gospel is truly a blessing to all of us.

But what if one hears the gospel, then does not do what the Lord Jesus said? If one refuses to obey the gospel, it brings the vengeance of Christ upon him! (2 Thess. 1:7-9). When some refused to listen to Jesus, He told them, *"I come not to judge the world, but to save the world. He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my sayings, hath one that judgeth him, the word that I spake, the same shall judge him in the last day"* (John 12:46-48). The gospel will be a blessing to those who accept it, but it will condemn all those who reject it.

The experiences of this life, with the pleasures and trials, can bring either blessing or curse. We determine, by how we respond, which it shall be. God can bring good out of any experience, if we let Him have His way in our lives. Just as the Scripture says, *"To them that love God all things work together for good"* (Rom. 8:28). May God grant us the wisdom to follow the right course, that everything in life may *"work together for good"* as we prepare to live forever with God. Every event can bring a blessing or a curse.
