Obedience and Compassion

"There is none righteous, not even one...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:10, 23). No one will be made right before God based on performance. However, that does not mean God does not care about obedience. The Lord who saves us by grace still wants us to do His will His way. He knows we will not be perfect in our efforts, but He still seeks our obedience.

Jesus says in Matt. 5:20, "For I say to you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." To be like the Christ we must learn these principles about obedience. Jesus says He didn't come to abolish the law of God, but to fulfill it. He will do away with law keeping as a means of salvation, but in fact as Paul says in Romans 7, the law was never designed to save people anyway. Jesus came to fulfill the law and the prophets. He would fulfill all the prophecies about the Messiah, proving He was the promised Son of God. He would also fulfill the law by keeping it perfectly.

To be like Christ, then, is to obey the laws of God. We cannot merely read and know the word of God. As James warns, "Prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves." (James 1:22). Jesus fulfilled all the demands of the Law of Moses. He asks us to fulfill all the demands of the gospel of grace. From faith and repentance, to submission and baptism, to redemption and holiness, the Lord asks us to be doers, not just hearers of His Word.

If we look closely at the Law of Moses, we will discover it was filled with concerns for widows, orphans and other poor people. There were countless laws governing how these people, on society's fringe, were to receive assistance in order to survive. Many of the "rules" that made up the Law were designed to ensure that the most unfortunate members of Jewish and Gentile populations were cared for and assisted with food, clothing, housing. An accurate understanding of the Law would have every Jew behaving in this loving, kind affirming manner.

Sadly, the Jews of the first century had substituted keeping the "rules" of the Laws of Moses, instead of honoring its priorities. All the Laws Moses laid out were intended to keep people in line with God's main desires. God wants people to honor Him with these rules, but many were designed to assist the poor in their times of need. To obey like Jesus did when he healed the leper in Luke 5:12-16 is to keep God's priorities.

A man after God's heart would always keep the Sabbath, practice circumcision and so on. But he would look beyond the rules to see the need for them. For Jesus it was never a matter of obeying God for obedience's sake. It was a matter of obeying God because that obedience would lead to a better life for him and for all those around Him. So, he stopped to help the leper, while the "devout" Jews around him kept their distance.

This is what Jesus means about our righteousness must exceed that of the Pharisees. The Law of Moses was never intended to a set of rules. It was designed to reveal the heart of God, His values and priorities. We must look beyond the rules and see the people behind them. Then we too will stop to help those in need, even if they are lepers, the outcasts of society. ~D. Thurman, excerpted

Worship Him in His Presence

It is often easy to lose sight of the very nature of worship and the result of this robs us of one of the great blessings God has for us. Before reading any more of this article stop and ask yourself, "Why do I come to worship each week?" There may be many reasons, but what is the fundamental, underlying reason you come to worship each week?

If you think first in terms of, "I do it because He commands me to," perhaps you should think more about it. Did not Jesus describe those who "...draw near to Me with their mouth, and honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me"? We do come to worship because He commands us, but if that is the primary reason, we are robbing ourselves of the true meaning of worship. Think about the following verses and my comments about them.

Psalm 100:2: "Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with singing." Notice how godly men came to worship realizing that this was the place, above all others, where we are "in His presence." We come with gladness and praise before Him. In worship we are truly in His presence.

Psalm 95:2: "Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving; let us shout joyfully to Him with psalms." Notice the plural pronouns in this verse. It is not a private time of praise David had in mind. It was "us" who came before Him in His presence. The next verse sheds even more reasons as to why we come to worship. "For the Lord is the great God, and the great King above all gods." We should stand in awe that this great God would so graciously allow sinful men to come into His presence.

Ecclesiastes 5:1-2: "Walk prudently when you go to the house of God; and draw near to hear rather than to give the sacrifice of fools...let not your heart utter anything hastily before God. For God is in heaven, and you on earth; therefore let your words be few." Every aspect of worship is important, but in most acts we are actively involved. However, God designed worship as a time when by preaching He would speak to us! We are in His presence and should come motivated to hear His words.

Psalm 100:1-4: "Make a joyful shout to the Lord, all you lands! Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with singing. Know that the Lord, He is God; it is He who has made us; we are His people and the sheep of His pasture. Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him and bless His name."

Worship is not just "making a payment" on a heavenly insurance policy. We do not come just to obey Him. Worship comes from hearts which long to praise Him in His presence. ~Dan Jenkins
